Sacrament of Confirmation Overview

The MULTI-year confirmation process has a lot of events and prerequisites that all are aimed at preparing the participants for the Sacrament of Confirmation. While it may seem like a lot, or daunting, it is designed for two years and is not meant to overwhelm but challenge. If at any time you or your child has a conflict or issue let me know as soon as possible so we can work together to find a proper solution.

The two goals of each year are as follows-

<u>Confirmation 1 Goal:</u> Share and practice their personal faith; learn, review, and apply the Catholic faith to their belief system or everyday lives, and build their own relationship with Jesus Christ Confirmation 1 Overview:

- Full, conscious and active participation at home, school, youth ministry (i.e. fulfilling responsibilities: chores, homework, attend class.... properly representing the Catholic life in all parts of life)
- Attendance of Confirmation Class (twice a month)
- Attendance of Mass (weekly)
- Attendance of 1 Retreat (Total)
- Participation in a Church Ministry (weekly)
- Year End Interview (In Summer Session)
- Sponsor and Saint information in progress (ready by time Year 2 interview)
- 1 Service Project and meaningful faith-based reflection (3 total over two-year program)

<u>Confirmation 2 Goal:</u> Engage and discuss deeper understanding of the Catholic faith and accept the call to discipleship past Confirmation.

Confirmation 2 Overview:

- Full, conscious and active participation at home, school, youth ministry (i.e. fulfilling responsibilities: chores, homework, attend class.... properly representing the Catholic life in all parts of life)
- Attendance of Confirmation Class (twice a month)
- Attendance of Mass (weekly)
- Attendance of 3 Retreats (Total)
- Participation in a Church Ministry (weekly)
- Final Interview (at midpoint of year)
- Sponsor and Saint information complete (by time of final interview)
- 3 Service Project and meaningful faith-based reflection (1 with sponsor)



Youth Ministry Agreements

Formed in order to create an atmosphere that is safe, encouraging, and maybe fun (in order).

AGREEMENTS:

Agreements are crucial in order to have all parties feel safe, heard, and honored.

RESPECT:

Hold in high regard.

Every day you pass through the door you are agreeing to abide by this set of agreements (even when there is no physical door).

Respect the place, the space, the time, and each other. Simple enough but has the most general goals I want to accomplish with "rules"

Agreement 1: Respect the place.

- the buildings/areas we use, keep them as clean and as nice as we can
- If it is not ours, or yours, then it is not for us or you

Agreement 2: Respect the space.

- Keep the space safe, with no condemnation, and possibly keep it private, it is not your story to share
- give what we are discussing or learning, a chance

Agreement 3: Respect the time.

- We have 1-2.5 hours a week together, giving us all the time now to focus the best we can on the task at hand, keeping other influences to a minimum like phones, music, etc.
- If you are late just enter in quietly

Agreement 4: Respect each other.

- Including you, and I, allow others a chance to share, let people express their opinions without judgment, and keep the negativity down
- Make this a great place to be for each other



Confirmation Commitment Form

Understanding Confirmation: Confirmation completes the grace of Baptism by a special outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which seal/confirm the baptized in unison with Christ and equip them for active participation in the worship and apostolic life of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1285). The key to Confirmation is active participation and therefore requires commitment. Although this journey is largely about formation in the faith, it is mostly about experiencing a relationship with Jesus in the faith and living the gospel. To accomplish this we require a firm commitment from all participants to the program. Below is a summary of what is expected from each candidate.

What we expect when you join Confirmation:

- o Consistent Confirmation preparation class, Mass, and ministry attendance
- Fulfillment of assigned reflections and tasks (i.e.: monthly family videos)
- o Openness to explore and develop spirituality/faith life
- Commitment to developing a real living relationship with Christ
- Respect for self/peers/ministers/teachers
- Openness to be changed for and by Christ
- o Desire to take ownership of faith and responsibilities connected to living faithfully

<u>Candidate:</u> By signing this form you agree to enter the discernment process for the Sacrament of Confirmation and fulfill all program requirements. Confirmation Sponsor Eligibility

(To be completed by sponsor)

The Sponsor's role is to assist the person in Christian Initiation. Also, together with the parent, the Sponsor presents the student for the Sacrament and helps to guide the student to live a life of holiness as a baptized Catholic. Being a sponsor is not just an honor given to a good friend or relative. Sponsorship implies a real appreciation of our Catholic Faith, a lifestyle that proclaims the truth, and sense of responsibility toward the young person being confirmed.

Please read the requirements for sponsorship before signing.

Canon 874 and 892 of the Code of Canon Law lists these requirements for the valid and lawful sponsorship in Confirmation:

A Sponsor:

- Must be mature enough to undertake this responsibility.
- Must have received the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion.
- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Must know the fundamental truths of the Faith and be a practicing Catholic who attends Mass on Sunday and receives the Sacraments regularly.
- May not be the father or mother of the one to be confirmed.
